## DISCOVER HOW YOU INTUITIVELY KNOW, by Stephanie Rachel Alt, M.S.

Learning how to process intuitive information has been my life's work for nearly thirty years. I am clairaudient, which means that I hear information in spoken thoughts about people: their personalities, interests, emotional triumphs, and conflicts. I also hear words of warning, urgent messages, and guiding instructions.

Like physical training, intuitive adeptness occurs with routine exercise. Developing your intuition begins with the belief that there is more operating than what you see, hear, and are able to touch, and there is more than one stream of consciousness; two minds, running at the same time. The Conscientious Mind deals with daily activity, is present based, and is linear in its thinking. The Intuitive Mind is collective, runs on instincts, stores our past history, and is boundless by nature.

Have you ever had an intuition that something was going to happen in

advance, and then much to your surprise it actually occurred? Do you recall saying, "I knew it," after the fact? Can you remember how you received this information? Was it in a picture? Did you hear words? Perhaps you felt something unusual physically?

There are three primary senses through which we process information: vision, hearing, and physical feelings. Identifying and specifying how you receive information is the basis for developing these skills further. What do you do once you perceive something out of the ordinary? Knowing what you feel specifically enables you to choose the best way to respond. There are ways to focus and clarify your insights, distinguish instincts from emotions, and specific instructions help fine-tune your inner radio so you can hear the instinctive voice, which I refer to as the Voice of a Higher Calling.

There are also the "miracles", manifesting hopes and dreams. This area of my life is the most humbling. I believe that having faith in a higher power that is listening and that cares continues to guide me to "ask". My prayers being answered more than once have blessed me and given me courage to go on in the face of adversity. You can learn ways to ask more specifically, and discover how your prayers are answered accordingly.

## Safety tips for Women, submitted by Virginia L. Cooper, Senior Vice President, SBA Lending, Monterey County

1. Tip from Tae Kwon Do: The elbow is the strongest point on your body. If you are close enough to use it, do!

2. Learned this from a tourist guide in New Orleans. If a robber asks for your wallet and/or purse, **DO NOT HAND IT TO HIM**. 4. Women have a tendency to get into their cars after shopping, eating, working, etc., and just sit (doing their checkbook, or making a list, etc. **DON'T DO THIS!**) The predator will be watching you, and this is the perfect opportunity for him to get in on the passenger side, put a gun to your head, and tell you where to go. **AS SOON AS YOU GET INTO YOUR CAR, LOCK THE DOORS AND LEAVE.**

5. A few notes about getting into your car in a parking lot, or parking garage:

A.) Be aware: look around you, look into your car, at the passenger side floor, and in the back seat.

B.) If you are parked next to a big van, enter your car from the passenger door. Most serial killers attack their victims by pulling them into their vans while the women are attempting to get into their cars.

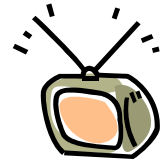

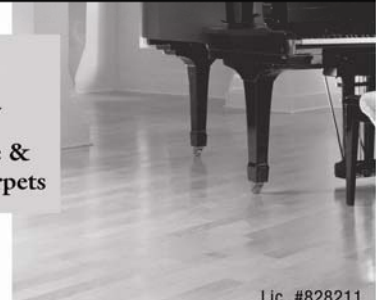
